Andrew and Kate Kemp Receive International Service Award

On Friday 4th May 2007, Andrew and Kate Kemp were presented with;

The Past District Governor Sir Kenneth Fung Ping Fan Foundation Rotary Club of Hong Kong International Service Award 2007

The Hong Kong based award is made on a discretionary basis to those individuals who have strong connections with Hong Kong but have provided "Service Above Self" across International borders.

The award to Andrew and Kate Kemp was for their outstanding work in alleviating the suffering of children from the Tsunami disaster in Thailand through the establishment of The Sarojin Khao Lak Community Fund and an ongoing commitment to the local community.

The award was presented at Baan Bang Krung School, in a tsunami affected region of Phang Nga, Thailand by Mr. Anthony Marr on behalf of the Sir Kenneth Fung Ping Fan Foundation.

The Sarojin Khao Lak Community Fund in conjunction with The Rotary Club of Hong Kong and CMP Asia had provided four additional classrooms for the school.

In accepting the award Kate Kemp said;

"Hong Kong is indeed an international city and it is wonderful that the city and its people are able to outreach to smaller and more rural communities such as Baan Bang Krung village.

We very much hope that The Sarojin Khao Lak Community Fund will continue to grow and serve the local community.
