Camillian Social Centre Takuapa And The Sarojin

Introduction

The Camillian Social Centre Takuapa, www.camilliantakuapa.org, is 15 minutes' drive from The Sarojin. It is part of the St. Camillus Foundation of Thailand and is a non-profit organization

providing day care and rehabilitation for children with disabilities. The centre provides free of charge day care for currently 20 children. Ages range from 4 - 16 years. Disabilities include down's syndrome, physical disabilities and autism. It is the only centre providing care for down's syndrome in Phang Nga province.

The centre's programs involve psychological and social development, dance, music, arts, crafts, daily physiotherapy care over seen by a doctor and team



from Phang Nga Hopsital, home visits and counseling for families. Two minibuses operate providing transfers for the children to and from the centre. By providing day care for the children the centre not only helps the children but also provides invaluable support to the parents and family by allowing them to go to work and attend other daily activities etc.

Fundraising

The centre is targeting to fundraise THB 50,000 per month / USD 1,700 to help cover of some of

its monthly operating expenses such as utilities, fuel, transport, meals, doctor visits, activities equipment etc.

The centre organized in November 2013 the first "Charity Bike Ride for Children Living With Disabilities", in November 2013 and this event has been ongoing annually every November. Over 200 adults and children from the community participate including staff and guests from The Sarojin, all helping raise much needed funds.
