## READING:

Savage, funny, frequently on the verge of teetering into lunacy, Ottessa Moshfegh's story – *My Year of Rest and Relaxation* – of a rich, beautiful (by her own admission), Columbia-educated New Yorker who decides to take a year-long, narcotics-induced sleep is a non-negotiable in your holiday carry-on this summer. ## VISITING:

My favourite thing to do of a Saturday? Head to Norwich, near my parents' home, and have a rummage through [Country & Eastern](#). A beautifully-constructed Victorian skating rink that now houses the South Asian Decorative Arts and Crafts Collection (it comprises over 4000 objects including Burmese lacquer umbrellas, Indian glass paintings, delicate Pakistani shrines) the upstairs of the vast vaulted hall is packed to the brim with textiles, ceramics, stoneware and furniture from India, Pakistan and Turkey, and all at very reasonable prices. I've come away laden with patterned bed linen, cushions and rough-hewn marble bowls.

## HOLIDAYING:

Forgo Phuket for the unblighted coastline of Phang Nga, Thailand – and bed down at [The Sarojin](#). A secluded 56-room hotel with a pleasingly minimal aesthetic, I visited in May and never wanted to leave. (Try and rouse yourself, though, to make the trip to Khao Phing Kan, otherwise known as James Bond island thanks to its starring status as the backdrop to *The Man With The Golden Gun*. The peaceful boat trip and magnificent rock formations are worth the journey.)
